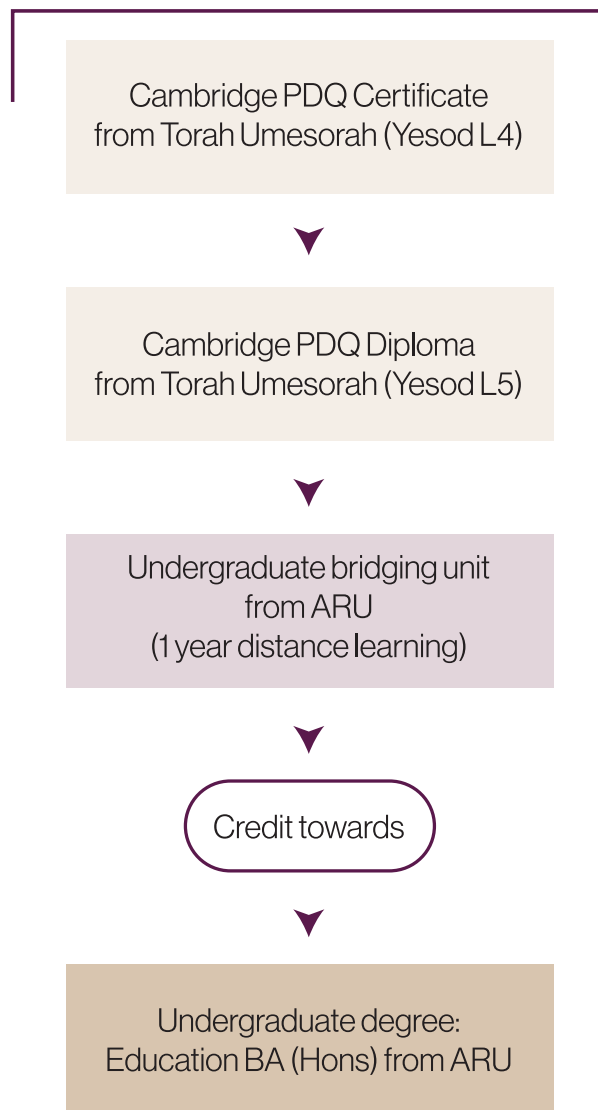

# Turn Your Teacher Training into a Qualification.

You have already completed the learning for the Level 4 Certificate in Teaching & Learning – now you need to complete your portfolio for accreditation.

Upon completing the Level 4 Certificate, you can progress through this pathway to achieve the Level 5 Diploma, followed by an Education BA (Hons) from ARU and eventually QTS.

## PATHWAY

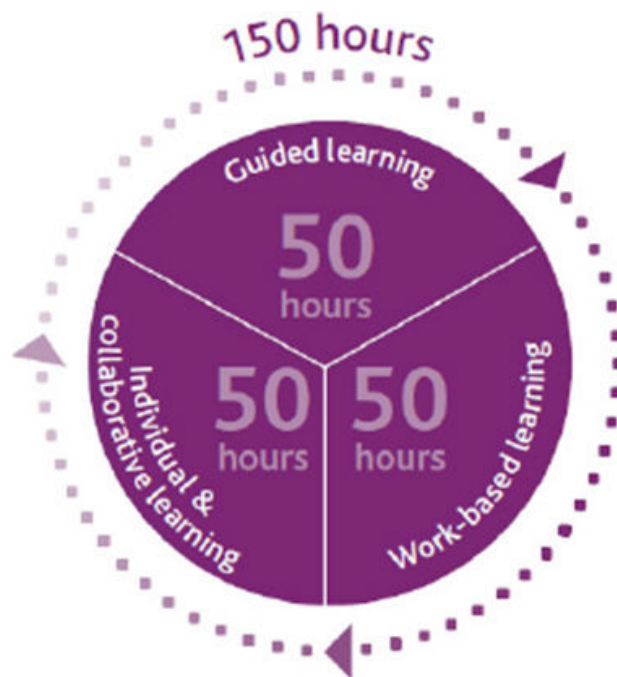


Each stage in the pathway is a stand alone and internationally recognised qualification.

# Level 4 Certificate – Your Next Step

## WHAT'S INVOLVED?

The Level 4 PDQ Certificate is comprised of 150 learning hours in total. You have already completed many of these learning hours in your teacher training course in seminary.



You will still need to complete the 50 Work Based Learning (WBL) hours and some of the Individual & Collaborative Learning (ICL) hours once you start teaching properly.

The 50 WBL hours are the hours spent in the classroom during the duration of the course where you have the opportunity to put into practice the different elements of teaching that you have learned, and the ICL hours will be the time you spend engaging in a series of activities closely related to what is going on in your classroom. These activities and related reflections produce evidence for assessment.



## **PORTFOLIO OF EVIDENCE:**

The course is assessed based on a portfolio of evidence comprising three units.

Each unit has three components:

Evidence of Practice

Evidence of Learning

Evidence of Reflection

### **Unit 1**

1 Observation of an experienced teacher

1 Essay (800 words)

1 Reflective piece (400 words)

### **Unit 2**

1 Lesson observed by mentor with completed lesson plan

1 Essay (600 words)

1 Reflective piece (600 words)

### **Unit 3**

1 Lesson observed by mentor with completed lesson plan

1 Teaching activity log

1 Essay (400 words)

1 Reflective piece (800 words)



## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Be employed in a school for a full school year, minimum 6 hrs per week
- Teach a group with a minimum of 6 students
- Be responsible for planning, teaching and assessing your students
- Access to a mentor to provide support and meet once a week

## THE ROLE OF A MENTOR:

In order to complete the course, you must have an assigned mentor who will be able to give regular support, advice and observations. Through discussion and questioning skills, mentors encourage candidates to reflect on their learning and on what it means for their approaches to teaching.

You will need to meet with your mentor once a week for 12 weeks, and complete a weekly reflection form based on your discussions.
